Artists Gallery

Keith's exhibition sub-committee have decided that it is time to put away the 'Lockdown Paintings' currently on display and hang paintings for our first featured exhibition. The first theme will be "**Winter**" and will start on **7th November** and run up to Christmas, or the New Year.

Please submit your paintings to Keith (either in person, or by leaving them at Gibson Street whenever we are open) preferably **before Sunday 1st November**. It would be good if we had a wide range of paintings from as many different artists as possible. We don't really want lots of paintings from the same artist (i.e. me!). So, please dig out any paintings which you may have with a 'Winter' theme – or get painting something new.

Let us know the title of the painting, the medium & the price, if you want to try & sell it.

Lockdown paintings have been selling like hotcakes. People seem to be attracted to the new-look Gibson Street and are coming in to buy. So, don't think your paintings aren't good enough to sell – we have already proved that people, who had no concept of selling their paintings, have made some sales and even been given commissions based on their pictures on display.

SAA

We have joined SAA as an arts club. That means that we have the ability to promote our activities through their magazine & website and to buy art supplies at a bit of a discount – which means that we will be able to re-stock the shop and pass on reduced prices to you. Additionally, membership gives us Public Liability Insurance, which means that we are covered in case any pictures fall on a visitor's head!

Sell your paintings on the NAC website

Note, if you can't manage to produce your own electronic copy of your painting, let me borrow the original and I can either scan it on my own new personal A3 scanner/printer, or photograph it if it is larger than A3 – all part of the service!

Office Technology

Thanks to a generous donation from Sheila Cooper, we now have a lovely big TV to replace the one damaged in the refurbishment (and another in the pipeline – update next time). This allows us to use it for presentations (in lessons, etc.) and to link with the office computer and printers to better use the capabilities of these.

Donation

We have just received a substantial donation from Junction Café.

Junction Café is a restaurant staffed by volunteers. They run out of Stakeford Methodist Church on Thursday lunchtime. All of their profits go to local community projects, small local charities and individuals in need. They have been running for 11 years. Sadly at the moment, due to coronavirus they have closed; as most of their volunteers are in the vulnerable category of over 70; as are most of their customers. They usually get between 65 and 85 people coming for lunch on Thursdays.

This significant donation is very welcome to help towards paying our rent at times when workshop and classes income is greatly reduced due to the enforced 'rule of six' class sizes. Thanks to Junction Café! We wish them well when their restaurant re-opens when life gets back to 'normal'.

COVID Workshops

The new COVID workshops have been going ahead with some success. We have been running four painting workshops; oils on Tuesday morning; a mix of watercolours and acrylics on Wednesday morning; acrylics on Thursday morning and watercolours on Thursday afternoon. Additionally, the Craft Club meets on a Wednesday afternoon and the East Coast Art Club re-started in their normal Wednesday evening slot.

Keith started his drawing session on Friday morning.

NAC Shop

We will continue to try to open on select Mondays, when the volunteers are available and get the message about when we will be open out as soon as possible by social media.
