...so you may be interested in learning more about the BellWether Project which is commissioned by Museums Northumberland BAIT, working in partnership with local organisations and funded by Arts Council England.

Museums Northumberland bait works in partnership to support more people in South East Northumberland to create and take part in inspiring and high quality arts experiences. All projects aim to build a stronger future with the people who live here.

It involves artists Trish and Nick from INSTAR who guide people through a range of art techniques inspired by the natural world, including printmaking, creative writing, collage and drawing.
