New classes!...

As you probably know, we have a variety of classes and clubs in both of our locations, Front St. and Gibson St., and we are excited to tell you that we can now offer you even more to choose from! Please read on for more information.

**Our classes** generally run for eight to 10 weeks. The cost is £4 for each two-hour session, which includes materials. In them, you will be introduced to different techniques, materials, and given plenty of opportunity to practice.

As spaces are limited, we do ask that if you are signing up for a class that you let the leader know if you decide you are unable to complete the course, thereby freeing up space for someone else.

Clubs are informal and here you will find people of varying degrees of experience using a variety of materials. The cost is £3 per session if you bring your own supplies, and £4 if

you wish to use the materials available at the studios. Whether you are a beginner or more experienced, there is always someone there to help you if needed!

The great news is that we now have over 100 members of NAC enjoying our classes and clubs and hope with our additional classes to get even more! The not-so-great news is that this makes it more difficult for our small team of volunteers to keep our art materials in good condition keep our studios clean and tidy, so we need your help!

Last Sunday, a few of us got together and gave our art materials a good clear up. We cleaned up and filled up all the watercolour palettes and washed over 250 acrylic and oil brushes—no mean feat, we can assure you!



Please help us keep these materials in tip top condition. You can do this by

- making sure that your watercolour palettes are cleaned after use and that you let the leader of your session know if any of the colours need filling up
- cleaning your brushes after using. This is extremely important, especially if they
  are acrylic or oil paint brushes. They need to be cleaned using hot soapy water
  and thoroughly dried.

We are sad to report that when we went through all the materials, we found a number of brushes were missing from the sets and a number were too badly damaged to keep, and thereby, need to be replaced. We don't want to have to raise prices to cover these losses, so please help us help you.

Some other general things you can do to help:

- clean the tables, painting boards and easels at the end of the session and any spillages (especially on the chairs) as soon as they happen. Any problems, let the session leader know as soon as possible
- make sure that the top of the paint is secured after you have taken your paint (acrylics, or oils). If you leave the top loose, the paint will solidify and be VERY difficult to remove to replace the top – especially the large acrylics tubs!

• if you use any of the studio's equipment; when you are finished, it needs to be put back in the correct place (in a clean condition)

We can only afford to have a cleaner come in once a week. As we get more and more people using our studios (which is a good thing!), it does mean that it has become increasingly difficult to keep our premises clean (and safe!). Again, we are asking you to help. There are just a few things that as a member you can do, which will go a long way to helping us all enjoy our time in the studios and helping us to save money, which in turn, keeps your fees low. Some examples:

- making sure to use the bins in the toilets to dispose of any materials other than toilet paper (we've had a few toilet blockages lately!)
- using the right bins in the kitchen to dispose of your rubbish—this helps us with recycling
- wash, dry and put away glasses, mugs, crockery, and cutlery after you have used them
- refill sachets, milk, biscuits, and cups when you use the last one in the retail unit on the worksurface – refills are in the appropriate drawer, or bulk storage is in the cupboards if the drawer is empty, and
- don't forget to let session leader know when you see any supplies (art and kitchen/toilet) running low

Apologies for what may seem like an onerous list of do's and don'ts. Fortunately, most of us do these things automatically, but hopefully this will prove useful to remind us all of our responsibilities as a member of our charity.



At the last committee meeting (held on the 24<sup>th</sup> of January), we had a lively discussion as to the purpose of our charity. The outcome was that we agreed that our aim is to promote and facilitate art, learning, and creativity; to create a welcoming environment that contributes to the health and well-being of our community.

We felt that we need to do more in encouraging new people to join the classes and groups and promote our studios through better and wider communication. As a result, we will be better utilizing social media (especially Facebook). We are also in the process of looking at adding some new classes/clubs, such as photography, print making, etc., and hopefully we'll be able to provide you more details soon, so stay tuned!

We also talked about the importance of displaying our members' art and encouraging our less experienced artists to 'hang a picture' on the wall. To this end, the session leaders will be on the 'lookout' for potential hangings, so expect some new and exciting displays coming soon! If you have something you would like to display, please just let your session leader know.
