Kicking off the New Yar, we held our Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Monday, the 9th of January. We are pleased to report that we are doing well financially overall, however, we agreed that there is an opportunity to make some improvements.

At the moment we have no formal 'members'. This means that any decisions we make as a charity are left entirely to the trustees. As we want to make the NAC the best place it can be for our community, we want to develop a membership scheme whereby you can become a member (if you choose) and thereby become more involved in our future AGMs and play a part in making decisions in how we operate. We will be looking at various ways we can do this over the coming months, so stay tuned!

### Another improvement we are making is in how we pay for our classes.

Unlike our clubs where the sessions are led by our volunteers (and thereby there is no cost to the studios), the classes provided by Ted are paid for by us. This means we need to have full classes to break even.

Over the last few months, attendance at Ted's classes has fluctuated, which means some classes operating at a loss. When we have vacancies, we need to either open spaces to new people or we need to ensure our costs are covered by asking people to pay for sessions they haven't attended.

Based on this, as well as providing people with the convenience of paying once a month, beginning in February, participants in Ted's classes will be asked to pay for their classes a month in advance (every four weeks). If you have booked a holiday or know you will be unable to attend a session in the month ahead, you will only be asked to pay for the classes you attend, but you must let Ted know in advance, otherwise, you will be asked to pay for the full month.

As our clubs are based on a 'drop-in' basis, the prepayment does not apply to our clubs. You can continue to pay a session at a time.

While our leaders are not there to 'teach' you, they are usually experienced artists and will do their best to help you as needed.
