- · Organising and/or helping run events, such as table top sales, outings for members, etc.
- · Weekend opening—just a few hours on aSaturday or Sunday, where you'll get the opportunity to meet all kinds ofpeople and share your enthusiasm for the art we do

These are just a few areaswhere we can use your help. There are lots more and we'll be highlighting them over the next few months.
