### **Committee news**

#### Some Exciting News!

On the 21st of March we found out we were awarded a grant from the National Lottery, RC North East and Cumbria Region and this was confirmed on 5th April in a meeting with Lottery representative Debby Flannery.

#### What does this mean for NAC? Lots!

**First of all,** we are now able to hire a full time person to cover administration and volunteer support and training. This will be a huge help to our volunteer team (currently numbering 26!) as well as to our members and visitors. So, stay tuned for the job posting coming soon!

**Secondly, the funding is spread over three years.** This gives us stability and contributes significantly to how we run and develop our charity. The funding will also help us pay for operational costs, such as rent, utilities, art materials etc.

Thirdly, and what will be really exciting for our community, is that we have received a contribution that will allow us to bring in additional tutors for Gibson Street activities, and as a result, we will be able to increase our sessions over both sites from 16 to 26 per week. If you know of anyone (maybe it could be you!) who might be interested in running classes, please let us know.

This funding will be instrumental in how we run the organisation and support our community. So, a big thank you to Kathy Urwin and our Trustees for working so hard in putting together our bid, and of course to the Lottery for our generous grant. The next three years will see us able to move into Phase Two of our expansion (more on this later on) and provide an even better service to our community.


The Chair's award went to Jeanette Neale for her work entitled 'Cobwebs'. For this, Steve will be personally funding a £15 voucher.

Steve says: "This, our first open exhibition, was a phenomenal success. When we dreamed up the idea, we never thought that we would receive artwork of such a high standard. Comments from visitors included 'we thought they were all by professional artists'. The quality and diversity of the artwork was of the highest standard and definitely a match for other local exhibitions. I'm glad that we left the choice of 'Best in Show' to the visitors' vote, as it would have been virtually impossible for one person to choose between the work on display."

"For my personal award, I wanted to recognise the advances which our members have all made in the quality of their work and the acceptance of challenges made by Ted and our other session leads to develop their techniques and to be adventurous. Jeanette certainly showed how she had embraced the challenge. From her traditional subtle delicate watercolours, she experimented with the use of Brusho and came up with something very artistic (and even had some strong colours!). Jeanette's adventurous approach is a good example for all of us to follow to try something new instead of just churning out 'more of the same'. "
