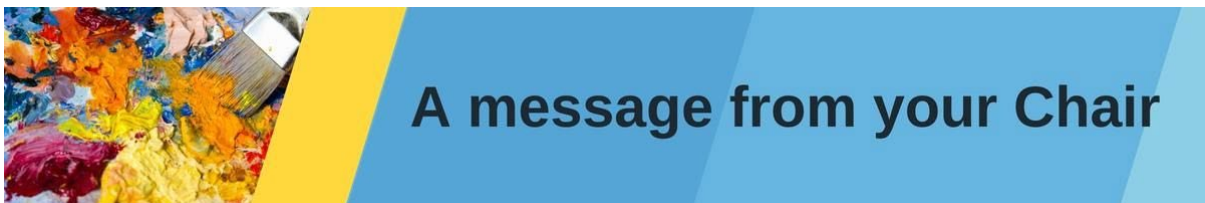

In this edition: Volunteer news, New courses and our Summer Exhibition



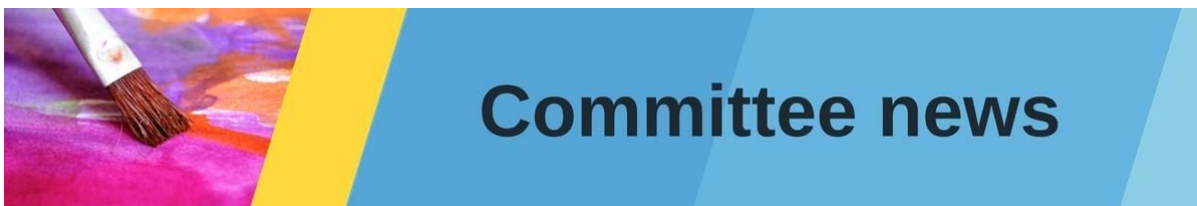
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Contact Wendy to book your place (or put your name on the waiting list if the first course is full). We will be adding additional sessions subject to demand and tutor availability.
