

A Message from your Chair

Looking back on the past year, it is very satisfying to see how successful our 'Arts for All' project has been over the past eight months. Funded by the National Lottery Community Fund (which also funds our irreplaceable Admin Officer, Wendy) and the Northumberland Inclusive Economy Community Partnership (NIECP), we have been able to bring in new tutors to deliver a wide range of courses and workshops.

We were able to provide ceramics, photography, pastels, watercolours (and other media), digital art, woodworking and textiles programmes, as well as a couple of cultural evenings. The statistics for which are truly amazing: In the 8 months we have delivered a total of **148** extra sessions, consisting of **792** attendee-sessions to a total of **134** unique individuals, many of whom attended multiple courses and workshops. I don't think we could have ever envisaged this level of increased engagement when we started the project.

Our thanks go out to all our new tutors for the fantastic job which they have done. Without them, we could never have achieved so much. We look forward to working with all of them, and perhaps some new faces too, as we go forward.

Unfortunately, the NIECP funding ended at the end of December. So, 'Arts for All' will (for now) be financed solely by the Community Fund. We are therefore having to streamline the number of courses which we will be offering at the start of 2025 to stay within budget. This means that, initially, we will not be able to offer the *full* range of courses - until such time as we manage to obtain further grant cover. We apologise to those who will not be able to partake in their preferred sessions.

Winning the two grants was a welcome windfall, providing a great opportunity to deliver the many extra courses and workshops. It truly was a unique programme of sessions, that we were grateful to be able to provide to the community. Rest assured that we are definitely going to work hard to try and make it happen again! Because we do plan to re-introduce the whole range of courses (and more) later in the year!!

We held our first committee meeting of 2025 on Monday, 13th January. It was a good time for us to reflect on the past year and begin planning for the upcoming one.

On reflection, we think everyone can agree that our past year has been one of change, growth, and development. We've had tremendous success with all the new and different courses and workshops we delivered: ceramics, photography, watercolour, pastels, to name just a few.

The number of new members has increased significantly; it is so great to see new people, all ages and abilities join in and help make NAC the 'go to' place in Newbiggin!

Planning ahead, our aim is to build on these successes and continue to provide a wide variety of classes and clubs. We want to go even further; and we are going to do this by building in more flexibility in what we offer, and how we run our classes and clubs.

A recent example of how we are doing this, is our Wednesday's Drawing and Mixed Media Course with tutor Gary Simpson. His approach of providing one-on-one support for all mediums: drawing, watercolours, and acrylics, has proven to be a hit, evidenced by the increasing number of people coming along. Well done, Gary! For anyone who wants to improve their drawing, or just paint their own thing, there are still some spaces left in his class.

We are also going to test run a brand new concept—a TGIF (thank goodness it's Friday) club where people can come along and spend as much or as little time as they want for a set fee. More details of this are found in our new courses section.

Our Celebrating Winter Exhibition was a hit! So many visitors and so many wonderful comments about the excellent artwork on display. Visitors were given the opportunity to vote for their favourite, and the winner is Tracey Galvin, who will receive a gift voucher next week. Well done, Tracey!

Our Friday evening's Children's Club is back in full force after the Christmas break, and we are very pleased to welcome two new volunteers to the team to help Sue Case run it. Donna Fitch and Elaine Porter: a huge thank you and we hope you enjoy helping the children as much as Sue does!

Just simple things like putting dirty dishes in the dishwasher, wiping down your table or the work surfaces in the kitchen after use, will go a long way in helping to keep our environment a clean one.



Did you know...

"I've lost my mojo"... How often have we heard someone say this (or have said it ourselves), especially this time of the year?

Look for inspiration. There are lots of ways to find art that inspires you. Pinterest, YouTube, Facebook art clubs, and even good old-fashioned books (we have plenty of them at our Front St. studio).

Try something completely different - leave your comfort zone. Sign up for a class in something you've never done before. Use materials you've never previously used. It can be fun and freeing.

Instead of trying to create your masterpiece, **create something fun**. Just play with your pencils, pastels or paints.

Look to a fellow class member to support and/or mentor you.

Lastly, don't give up coming to your clubs or classes—even if you don't feel like making art, come for the social aspect—have a chat, enjoy a coffee, and hopefully before too long, you'll get your mojo back!
