

A Message from your Chair

Some of you have been asking where I've been lately, and I'd like to assure you that I haven't been hiding away! Rather, I have been working behind the scenes seeking out and applying for grants. As you can imagine, due to the current economic climate, there are fewer grants available to apply for – and those that are have proven difficult to secure. This means that our access to funding has decreased. As a result, I need to spend even more time looking for new sources of funding and finding other ways to cover our operating costs.

We spent a lot of time at our last committee meeting (2nd June) discussing how we can increase our income, and agreed that one of the ways (unfortunately) is to increase the fees and donations for our classes and clubs. However, the increase is slight (as set out in the following section), and as always, if there is anyone who finds this a hardship, please talk to me or Wendy.

It's not all doom and gloom! We have a couple of things to celebrate:

First, visitors to Gibson Street will have seen the new ceramics kiln, financed by courtesy of a grant from Sir James Knott Trust. It is temporarily installed in the studio, but will be transferred in due course to its permanent home in the shed in the back yard once we have the foundations and electricity supply sorted.

Second, thanks to the hard work of Brian and Wendy our Gibson St. studio walls have a new coat of paint! Well done, and thank you!



Committee Meeting Update

We've certainly had a very busy and productive spring! Lots of new classes and workshops covering a variety of activities. Everything from watercolours, calligraphy, photography, jewellery making, etc., to something completely different—the art of slow cooking.

Most of our recent classes and workshops have been made possible through the funding we've received from NIECP. This grant subsidised the fees of the tutors and the provision of the materials and equipment. Unfortunately, as all good things must come to an end, so has the funding. This means that we must work even harder over the coming months to seek out, and apply for, further funding so that we can continue to offer the variety of new classes and workshops that have been so successful to date.

Until such time that we can access more funding to run new classes and workshops, we will continue to run our regular classes and clubs. However, due to the cost-of-living increases that we, along with our many suppliers are experiencing, will have to increase our fees for the classes and clubs. This was a difficult, but necessary decision, as the fees we get from our classes and clubs do not cover the costs of running them.

However, as we are committed to keeping the fees as low as possible, the increases will be minimal, with most increasing by only £1, except for the pastels class which, due to the higher cost of materials, will increase by £2. These increases will take effect as of 1st July.

On a much happier note, we are very excited to let you know that we have Annie Twyford, an arts intern from Newcastle University, joining us for this month. Annie will be mentored by Leigh and will be developing and delivering a workshop for us. This will give her a fantastic opportunity to gain some 'real life' working experience, and at the same time, benefit us with her educational experience and perspective. Welcome Annie!
