Kintsugi is an art form and techniques that is based on the philosophy that flaws and imperfections are not something to disguise, but to celebrate. 'Brokenness' becomes part of the story, and the repaired piece is often considered even more valuable and beautiful than before.



All the participants thoroughly enjoyed the workshops and the resulting exhibition can only be described as stunning!

During the internship there were also opportunities for Annie to see how the Art Centre operated re Trustee meetings, attending clubs and classes and assisting in curating the monthly exhibitions.

Did you know...

Your Can Trick your Brain!

When it comes to making art, our brains are known to play tricks on us. They *think* they know what something should look like and we are tricked into drawing what we think we see instead of what's *really* in front of us. Here are some tips on how you can outsmart your brain...

Take photos of your work in progress. Looking at them on a phone screen reveal flaws you don't notice on the easel—great for spotting a wonky perspective or overworked areas.

View your work in a mirror. It instantly reveals composition issues, symmetry problems or anything 'off'. Your brain sees it as new, and mistakes jump out.

Stuck on a portrait? Flip your reference photo and your drawing upside down. This helps you focus on shapes and angles instead of what your brain thinks a face should look like.

Try squinting—squinting blurs out the details and lets you focus on contrast and overall shapes.

We have spaces available in our All Media class with Gary, Wednesday afternoons, from 1-3. This is a unique class where participants can paint their 'own thing' but with support and guidance from Gary as needed. It's a fun and friendly environment suitable for beginners as well as for those more experienced.



Creating art on a Friday is a great way to wind down at the end of the week, or to gear up for your weekend. Why not come by our Front St. studio on Fridays, for our TGIF club? We are open from 10-2 and for just £5 or £6 (if you use our materials), you can spend an hour or all four hours, doing your own thing while enjoying the company of others.
