We're delighted to introduce Lara McFarland, our new art intern! Lara will be with us over the coming months, supporting workshops and developing her own exciting ideas—including a brand-new art course designed with your input (see below!).

A little something about Lara:

Hello! My name is Lara McFarland, and I am going to be running an 8-week course here at Newbiggin Art Centre. I am a fourth-year student studying Fine Art at Newcastle University who loves bringing people together through art. I have organised group exhibitions over the past few years at university, and most recently I had the honour of being selected for my first solo exhibition at High Bridge Works this past January.

What inspires me and my art the most is when I open my eyes to the beauty in mundane objects around us. Seeing the sun hit the leaves in the trees just right. Seeing friends huddle round a table all holding different coloured mugs. Seeing a smiley face sticker left by someone on a lamppost.



To me, truly 'seeing' as an artist begins with noticing the subtle details others might overlook. This way of seeing is at the heart of my course, and it's what I'm most excited to share with others.

As an artist, I use lots of different mediums, going from loose oil paintings one day to detailed charcoal drawings the next. I use photographs, oil pastels, watercolour, ink, acrylic paint, and most recently I have been venturing into sculpture.

I've found that trying a bit of everything keeps my creativity flowing—and it means I can teach a variety of techniques, so you can discover what really works for you.

I've run classes before with an emphasis of bringing people together through art, and I can't wait to do the same with this community at NAC!

Did you know...

We think that sharing tips with each other is important. Here is the latest collection of handy hints, clever techniques, and practical tools - shared by artists in our community to help you get the most out of your time in the studio. Don't forget, we love getting your ideas and suggestions - just send them along to Wendy so we can add them into our next newsletter.

When painting with acrylics, try misting your palette with water to keep the paints from drying out too quickly. A small spray bottle works wonders—especially on warm days.

™ Use References, Not Replicas

Photos are a great starting point, but don't feel like you have to copy them exactly. Move things around, combine multiple images, or play with colour and proportion. Let your own voice come through.

ິ Don't Fear the Ugly Phase

Every artwork has a moment where it looks rough or unfinished—don't give up! It's a natural part of the creative process. Keep going and let your work evolve with layers and time.

Step Back for a Better View

Temporarily stepping away from your work can help you see it with fresh eyes. Try viewing it from across the room or snapping a photo on your phone—you'll spot things you hadn't noticed before.

: Limit Your Palette

Using fewer colours can lead to stronger, more harmonious results. Try choosing just 3–5 colours for a project and explore how much you can do with them.

(ছ) Get Unstuck with a Shift

Feeling blocked? Switch gears. Doodle, write, or start something unrelated. Creativity often comes back when you stop forcing it.

Look After Your Materials

Brushes last longer when cleaned right after use. Rinse thoroughly, reshape the bristles, and store them upright (or flat) to keep them in good condition.

Clean-Up Made Easy

• Baby Oil works brilliantly for cleaning Gelli plates (thanks, Nick!) Shampoo helps remove oil paint from your hands—gentler than solvents and easier on your skin (thanks, Christine!)
