Hot News: Our Kiln Has Arrived!

At long last — we're fired up and ready to go! Thanks to a generous grant from *The Sir James Knott Trust*, we're thrilled to announce that our ceramics kiln is now up and running.


The kiln was kindly sold to us at a great price by Katie Siddle of Stocksfield — nearly new, perfectly sized, and just what we needed. A big thanks also goes to Craig

Hancock for helping with transport and to our own Steve, who brought it safely to the studio at Gibson Street.

After making sure all the safety measures were in place, Saskia and Steve performed the first test firing over the weekend — followed by a second firing on Monday. The results? A total success! The biscuit-fired ceramics look fantastic and have sparked lots of excitement.

Meanwhile, behind the scenes, Steve was busy preparing the foundation for the kiln's new permanent home. Over the weekend he cleared and prepped the backyard, and by Monday, he was wheelbarrowing a whopping 1.5 tonnes of concrete

from the front of the shop to the back yard — all by hand! (He may not be Mr Universe *just* yet... but we're not ruling it out.)

This is a huge step forward for us. Not only will we be able to support more advanced ceramicists — particularly those who've taken part in our classes — but we're also laying the groundwork (literally!) to expand our ceramics clubs and bring back more workshops and classes in the future.

Lara's New Art Course: Discover a New Way of Seeing — and Creating — Art

Starting Monday, 27th October, from 1–3 PM at our Front St. studio, join Lara (our talented new art intern) for a transformative 7-week course designed to spark curiosity, unlock creative confidence, and offer a fresh approach to making art.

Inspired by your feedback from her recent survey, Lara has crafted a program that welcomes all levels — from complete beginners to seasoned artists. Each week, you'll explore practical techniques like drawing with intention lines, mixing expressive colours, and using everyday and natural materials for mark making. You'll also dive into basic art history to understand how different styles can influence your work, learn to draw from real objects (not just photos), and discover how to loosen up and express yourself more freely through your art.

By the end of the course, you'll walk away not only with new skills, but also a deeper appreciation for your unique creative voice — and a new habit of seeing the world through an artistic lens, wherever you go.

Keep an eye open for her poster and make sure you book early as this course is sure to be filled up quickly!

Did you know...

Here are seven unusual (and fun!) tips for beginners or people who are in a rut

1. Make "Ugly" Art on Purpose

Set out to create the worst piece you possibly can. Scribble, smudge, mismatch colours. Why? It removes the pressure of perfection and frees up your creativity. You might just discover something you *love* in the mess!

2. Use Your "Wrong" Hand

Try drawing or painting with your non-dominant hand. It breaks your habits, forces you to slow down, and helps you focus on form and feeling instead of control. It also builds confidence when you go back to your usual hand!

3. Paint to Music

Put on your favourite song and let your brush or pencil move to the rhythm. Don't aim to create a picture — just *respond*. It's a great way to loosen up and let emotion guide your marks.

4. Draw Without Looking at the Page

Try "blind contour drawing" — look at your subject but keep your eyes off the paper. It sounds ridiculous, but it trains your eye to see *really* well and often results in bold, expressive lines you wouldn't get otherwise.

5. Talk to Your Art

Stuck? Say, "What do *you* want to be?" or "Where are you trying to go?" Out loud. It sounds silly, but it shifts your mindset from control to conversation — and can actually help unblock creative decisions.

6. Steal Like a Beginner

Pick a favourite artist and copy a small piece of their work — not to pass it off as your own, but to *learn how it feels* to use their techniques. It's like learning guitar by playing other people's songs before writing your own.

7. Start a "Bad Idea" Sketchbook

Dedicate a sketchbook to all the weird, silly, or "that'll never work" ideas. No pressure to share it. Often, these experiments turn into your most original work — or at least give you a good laugh.

Bottom line? Making art isn't about being "good." It's about exploring, expressing, and enjoying the process. Be curious. Be messy. Be brave. Your creativity is a muscle — not a magic trick.
