...that looking at art for just 10 minutes can lower stress levels? Studies show that simply being around creative work—paintings, photography, sculpture—helps slow your heart rate and boost your mood. (Great excuse to pop into the studio more often!)

...you don't need lots of fancy materials to be creative? Some of the world's most famous artists created masterpieces using recycled paper, cardboard, and leftover paint. Your "rubbish pile" might be your next brilliant idea.

...learning a new skill at any age boosts memory and brain health? Trying a new workshop—whether it's watercolour, lino printing, or crafts—gives your brain the same kind of workout as puzzles and games.

...drinking tea while doing something creative actually improves focus? It's the combo of a warm drink plus a relaxed activity. So, your mid-session cuppa is basically a productivity tool.

...the average pencil can draw a line 35 miles long? That's more than the distance from Newbiggin to Alnwick. Think of that next time you sharpen yours!

...sharing your artwork—even when it feels scary—can make you more confident? Positive feedback actually rewires the brain to be braver next time.
